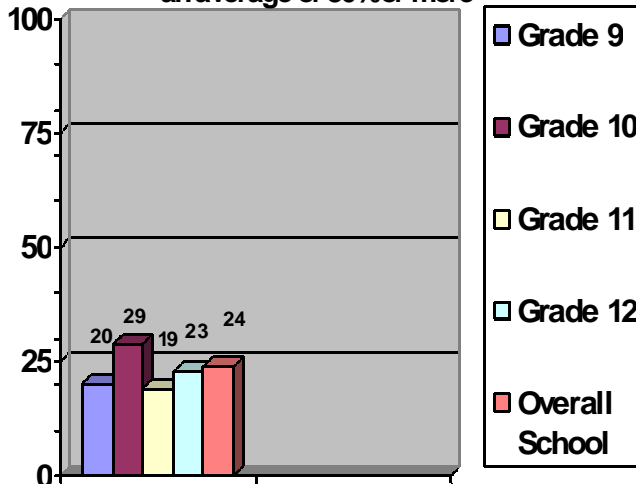

Guidance Department

Welcome back to all returning students and a special welcome to students new to the SJDB community. The Guidance and Career Education Department will continue to assist students with academic, interpersonal and career matters. Student timetables are now set for the year. Guidance Counsellors will be providing several in-services for our students to prepare them for academic success. All grade 9 students will be given an orientation to the guidance department - September 15 – 19--to familiarize them with the services we provide. Guidance Counsellors will be providing in-services for grade 12 students throughout the academic year - the first taking place during the week of September 15 – 19--to help prepare them for post-secondary destinations. Students will be provided with key information regarding application deadlines to college and university programs well as a schedule of apprenticeship, college and university liaison visits to our school. It is crucial that all grade 12 students attend the workshops and in-services provided for them so that they may obtain vital information necessary to help them make informed post-secondary decisions. It is the responsibility of all grade 12 students to attend these sessions. St. Jean de Brebeuf C.H.S. 2007-2008 E.Q.A.O. Results

I would like to commend the hard work of the St. Jean Brebeuf staff towards the preparation of the Ministry mandated Literacy and Numeracy tests for the year 2007-2008. As we have seen in the past, our school has achieved excellent results both at the academic and applied levels. In March 2008, all of our grade 10 students wrote the O.S.S.L.T. Literacy test and once again we were right at the provincial average, (83%) that is, students who received a score of level 3 or higher. In January and June of 2008, all of our grade 9 students wrote the E.Q.A.O. Numeracy test and once again our students scored right at the Board overall averages both at the Applied and Academic levels (Applied 36% and Academic 79%).

We will continue to use these results in improving the success rate by analyzing where our strengths and weaknesses were. We will continue our after school literacy and numeracy remedial courses in helping all of our current grade 9 and 10 students. Diagnostic testing in math and literacy also took place during our grade 9 orientation which helped us identify some gaps in students learning and as such, remedial help has been offered to them. We look forward to a very promising year as we continue to strive towards excellence across the province in our Board.

“Safe and Caring School Communities”

Dear Parents/Guardians:

The York Catholic District School Board has a primary priority and goal to ensure a safe learning environment for all of our students and staff in our school community.

As part of our safety initiative this year, St. Jean de Brebeuf Catholic High School, along with all other schools in the York Catholic District School Board, will be practicing a variety of safety protocols with students and staff.

The week of **September 29 – October 3, 2008** has been designated as “**Safety Awareness Week**”. During this week, we will be rehearsing a variety of emergency school procedures to acquaint students and staff with the precautionary steps to take in the event of such things as a warning of severe weather, an intruder or a bomb threat. In addition, throughout the year we will hold practice drills to acquaint students with various emergency protocols. Teachers will review these procedures with students in class prior to our practice drills.
